



# Dane County joins local and national partners to support immigrants in our community

February 2017

Dane County Executive proposes 75K immigrant assistance fund and new position dedicated to immigrant support.

April 2017

Dane County Board embraces and augments funding and encourages an application to The Vera Institute of Justice (2016 RES-572).

August 2017

The Immigration Coalition — a body independent of government officials consisting of 8 local providers—meets and creates a MOU supporting emergency needs via the immigration assistance fund.

September 2017

Fabiola Hamden announced as Dane County’s first Immigration Ombudsperson (Human Services Department)

September 2017

Dane County is one of 12 jurisdictions to win the Safe Cities grant providing area legal service providers with technical assistance and \$100,000 to provide deportation defense.

September 2017

The Madison Community Foundation (MCF) designates a fund which the coalition will draw from as emergencies occur. Individuals may donate to this fund via Madison Community Foundation.
